The nonprofit group EveryoneEatz recently honored the Plano Police Department during a 9/11 first responder appreciation event at In-Fretta Pizza.

EveryoneEatz has provided 387,500 free meals to area residents since the pandemic began in March, according to organizers.

The organization, founded by In-Fretta Pizza owner Ram Mehta, has also provided more than 50,000 face masks and other personal protective equipment, along with free COVID-19 tests for more than 5,000 people.
